What is Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM)?

Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) Planning began in 2002 as the result of the passage by California voters of Proposition 50, followed by passage of Proposition 84 in 2006. The bonds, among other priorities, authorized the expenditure of several billion dollars in general obligation bonds to fund a variety of water and watershed-related projects. The funding of water improvement and supply projects was specifically tied to the creation of plans by regionally focused groups, which were to take into account water supply, water quality and water-related environmental considerations. These plans became known as Integrated Regional Water Management Plans (IRWMP).

IRWM is aimed at securing long-term water supply reliability within California by first recognizing the inter-connectivity of water supplies and the environment, and then pursuing projects yielding multiple benefits for water supplies, water quality, and natural resources. IRWM is characterized as a collaborative effort to manage all aspects of water resources in a region. IRWM crosses jurisdictional, watershed, and political boundaries; involves multiple agencies, stakeholders, individuals, and groups; and attempts to address the issues and differing perspectives of all the entities involved through mutually beneficial solutions.

Yuba IRWMP Update

History of the Yuba IRWMP

The Yuba IRWM is a collaborative planning effort that adopted their first Integrated Regional Water Management Plan (IRWMP) in 2008. Diverse stakeholder involvement was a priority from the beginning, and the preparation of the initial IRWMP included participation by a variety of interests representing water supply, conservation, recreation, agriculture, and community interests, as well as federal and local government.

The IRWM governance group, known as the Regional Water Management Group (RWMG), acts as a vehicle to bring project-related implementation funding into the Yuba region. The RWMG also brings stakeholders together to identify water management priorities and develop projects to meet those priorities. Priorities already identified by the group are: water quality (maintaining and restoring), water quantity (for both people and the environment), and environmental quality (restoration and preservation).

What are options for Tribal involvement?

- Participation in developing the revised content for the Yuba IRWMP document
- Integration of Tribal concerns and methodologies into the design of nontribal IRWMP projects (especially projects which relate to natural resources).
- Facilitation of Tribal collaboration with Yuba region project sponsors to integrate Tribal concerns and issues into project design
- Development of projects directly with Tribes, Tribal members and Tribal entities which will result in benefits either directly to the Tribe or to natural resources important to the Tribe.
- Active pursuit of funding in support of these projects

In a letter dated October 2, 2013, the Yuba County Water Agency (YCWA) provided you with information regarding a contract YCWA has signed with the State of California (State) to act as grantee for the Yuba County portion of the Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) program in California.

The IRWM program is the result of Proposition 50, which was passed by voters in 2002 to serve as one of the primary vehicles for water-related planning and project funding in California. IRWM is aimed at securing long-term water supply reliability within California by first recognizing the inter-connectivity of water supplies and the environment, and then pursuing projects benefiting water supplies, water quality, and natural resources. This state-wide process has resulted in the identification of over 45 IRWM planning areas in California, including the Yuba County region, and will be implemented through Integrated Regional Water Management Plans (IRWMP) being developed by regionally focused groups.

The Yuba County IRWMP is being developed by a collaborative planning effort by a variety of diverse stakeholders that comprise the state-mandated Regional Water Management Group (RWMG), of which YCWA is a member. The RWMG adopted their first plan in 2008 and is currently working to update the IRWM Yuba County plan. As part of this process, two meetings were held on October 16, 2013 and October 30, 2013 to provide information regarding the IRWM, and to seek tribal comments, concerns, and information.

By way of this letter, YCWA once again requests your comments and concerns regarding the plan to ensure that tribal interests are taken into account. To accomplish this, the Draft IRWMP will be posted for public comment on the internet at <u>www.yubairwmp.org</u>. It will be available for a minimum of 60 days, beginning on November 10, 2014 and concluding on January 10, 2015. No confidential or sensitive information will be included in the posted plan. The Draft Plan was revised based on all comments received on the initial draft plan sections through August 2014.

To better assist in your review of the Draft Plan, please find an overview of the IRWM and the IRWM Plan in Attachment 1. The attachment also details opportunities for tribal input and engagement in this process. Additionally, it should be noted that the IRWM process has two primary components: 1) development of the IRWM Plan, which identifies key water management issues and objectives, and further identifies projects to address those issues, and 2)

providing the opportunity for concerned stakeholders to gather and discuss water management issues over time. It is our intention that this planning effort will eventually result in significant state funding for locally identified water resources-related projects.

YCWA and the RWMG welcome your involvement in the IRWM process and invite your comments on the Draft Plan. Please provide written comments, concerns, or recommendations on the IRWM Plan within 60-days of the November 10, 2014 posting of the document. ATTACHMENT 1

WHAT IS INTEGRATED REGIONAL WATER MANAGEMENT (IRWM)?

Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) Planning began in 2002, as the result of the passage of Proposition 50 by California voters. Prop 50 authorized the expenditure of \$3.4 billion in general obligation bonds to fund a variety of water and wetlands projects. The funding was specifically tied to the creation of plans by regionally focused groups, directed by program-related guidelines to take into account water supply, water quality and water-related environmental considerations. These plans became known as Integrated Regional Water Management Plans or IRWMPs. The California Department of Water Resources (DWR) administers the IRWM program.

IRWM is aimed at securing long-term water supply reliability within California by first recognizing the inter-connectivity of water supplies and the environment, and then pursuing projects yielding multiple benefits for water supplies, water quality, and natural resources. IRWM is characterized as a collaborative effort to manage all aspects of water resources in a region. IRWM crosses jurisdictional, watershed, and political boundaries; involves multiple agencies, stakeholders, individuals, and groups (known collectively as the Regional Water Management Group [RWMG]); and attempts to address the issues and differing perspectives of all the entities involved through mutually beneficial solutions.

WHAT IS AN IRWMP?

According to DWR, an IRWMP is a comprehensive planning document to encourage regional strategies for management of water resources.

An IRWMP identifies a broad spectrum of management strategies, the benefits of integrating water management strategies, and priorities for implementing projects and programs. An IRWMP is a comprehensive planning document to encourage regional strategies for management of water resources. The IRWMP identifies projects which can be implemented to meet the goals and objectives articulated in the Plan. To be eligible for DWR implementation funds, a project must have been evaluated by regional stakeholders during preparation of the IRWMP.


At a minimum, an IRWMP will:

- Describe the major water-related objectives and conflicts within a region;
- Consider a broad variety of water management strategies (to include, for example: ecosystem
 restoration, water supply reliability, flood management, groundwater management, recreation and
 public access, storm water capture and management, water conservation, water quality protection
 and improvement, water recycling, conjunctive use, desalination);
- Identify an appropriate mix of water demand and supply management alternatives, water quality
 protections, and environmental stewardship actions to provide long-term, reliable, and high
 quality water supply and to protect the environment;
- Identify disadvantaged communities in the region and take the water-related needs of those communities into consideration;
- Consider greenhouse gas emissions of identified programs and projects; and
- Evaluate the vulnerability to climate change/weather variability of water management systems in the region.

OPTIONS FOR TRIBAL INVOLVEMENT

The options for Tribal Involvement are many. The options shown below are those which have already been identified by the RWMG. A review by Tribal members may identify additional options for involvement as well.

- Participate in the meetings of the Regional Water Management Group (RWMG) by having a designated representative of your tribal entity attend. The RWMG is the group responsible for revisions to the Plan, approving projects for inclusion in the Plan and deciding on which projects go forward for funding applications.
- Develop projects for inclusion in the Plan to address Tribal water issues: water quality, water supply, and watershed stewardship. Projects can address ground or surface water and can range from simple infrastructure improvements (such as leak detection and repair, replacement of aging distribution pipes, replacement of leaking valves and pumps, etc.) to more complex treatment infrastructure such as treatment plant repairs/upgrades, restoration of creeks or wetlands, and reducing greenhouse gas emissions by installing solar power of water treatment and pumping facilities.
- Working with other stakeholders in the region to integrate traditional practices into project design and implementation.


