The Olivehurst Public Utility District (OPUD) public pool, located next to the Olivehurst Community Park, is the last functioning swimming pool available to the public in the county. It required a major renovation two years ago when the main pool was realigned with local tax dollars, but the allocated pool funds were insufficient due to rising costs. Major infrastructure, equipment repair, and safety items are still needed in order for the pool to meet compliance standards and ensure a safe, operational pool remains open for all Yuba County community members.					

#### PROJECT RATIONALE/ISSUES STATEMENT

Without the required improvements, it is likely that safety risks due to outdated infrastructure will cause the pool to be completely shut down in the very near future. In 2023, the number of open swims at the community pool was 2,505 and for children under 17, with a total of 375 free swim lessons. The pool is a hub of activity for the local community during the summer, and it is used by residents of Wheatland, Plumas Lake, Marysville, Linda, and other nearby jurisdictions. In order to keep access to the pool affordable for local residents (many of whom are designated severely disadvantaged), OPUD tries to keep entrance fees low. Thanks to their partnership with Yuba Water Agency in the past year and First 5 for their generous financial support, we are able to supply free entries and swim lessons to children 17 and under. The benefits that the pool and the swim lessons provide the surrounding communities are significant. Without external funding support, OPUD will not be able to charge viable entrance fees to cover the needed updates. This project will allow OPUD to keep the last public pool in the county open and operational.


